Presidential Address

A Cháirde,

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Standing Orders

1. The Cathaoirleach shall preside over all meetings and shall see that the rules of the organisation be enforced sensibly and fairly on all occasions.
2. Motions to the Annual General Meeting, which shall be in the name of an affiliated area or Provincial Council and formally adopted at a meeting of that body, must reach the National Secretary not later than the last Friday in January.
3. All nominations for positions on the National Committee which shall be in the name of an affiliated area or Provincial Council and formally adopted at a meeting of that body, must reach the National Secretary not later than three weeks before the AGM.
4. The National Committee shall consider all motions and nominations and decide if they are in order and acceptable for consideration at the AGM.
5. Copies of the agenda for the AGM together with list of motions and nominations for elections to National Committee shall be circulated to all affiliated areas and Provincial Councils at least 7 days before the AGM.
6. Amendments and agenda will be with the National Secretary in writing in the name of an affiliated area or Provincial Council at least one hour before the AGM.
7. Contrary motions shall not be accepted.
8. All motions must be clear and unambiguous and must not conflict with the aims and objectives of Cumann na mBunscol.
9. (a) To be deemed in order a motion must be implementable and must be specific to Cumann na mBunscol.
(b) However motions may call on Cumann na mBunscol to negotiate with relevant bodies on a specific matter that is of interest to Cumann na mBunscol.
10. The mover of a proposal shall speak for not more than three minutes.
11. The seconder of a proposal shall speak for no more than three minutes.
12. No motion shall be discussed for more than 20 minutes. The motion must be disposed of when the 20 minutes have elapsed.
13. The mover shall have the right of reply in all cases. 2 minutes maximum.
14. Voting shall be by a show of hands on all motions. A simple majority shall ensure the adoption of any item. Where rule changes are proposed, a two thirds majority shall be necessary in every instance to ensure their adoption.
15. The usual method for the disposal of amendments and agenda shall be followed.
16. In the event of the proposition "That the question be put", and that this proposition be seconded, the presiding Cathaoirleach shall on a show of hands either continue the debate or 'Put the question'.
17. In the event of the proposition "That the AGM, move to next business " and that this proposition be seconded, the presiding Cathaoirleach shall put the proposition to a vote immediately. If defeated the debate shall be resumed.
18. If a position on the National Committee be contested, voting shall be by secret ballot. A successful candidate must have 50% + 1 of the valid votes cast by delegates present and voting at the AGM. In the event of a tie, the winning candidate will be drawn by lot.
19. The chairman may at his discretion ask if there is no obvious objection to a motion that the motion be put in order, to save time.
20. The chairman may at his discretion and in consultation with order officers change the order of business in the interest of efficiency.
21. The order of business may also be changed at the request of a majority of delegates present and voting.
22. Only properly constituted delegates may speak at the AGM. Other speakers may only address the AGM when prior arrangements are made through the National Committee.

Oráid an Chathaoirleach

Cathaoirleach Joe Lyons began his address by welcoming all delegates and thanking them for travelling. He made reference to the 'unique' nature of Cumann na mBunscol and pointed out that it relied on the goodwill and dedication of volunteer teachers. He mentioned that there are over five thousand primary schools on the island of Ireland and that it was a great testament that Cumann na mBunscol reaches the vast majority of those schools. Joe lamented the loss of games over the past two years during the pandemic and said that it was a shame that children were denied the chance to represent their schools during this time.

The Cathaoirleach stated Cumann na mBunscol's belief that it is essential to children's well-being that our games return as soon as possible. He said that a primary focus of the National Committee in the past year was navigating a safe way back to playing Gaelic Games

but he alluded to the complexity of the situation and the confusion surrounding rules and restrictions. Joe informed delegates that he and the committee had been lobbying TDs, INTO reps and others to gain further clarity and seek a return to games. He thanked John Boyle (INTO) for bringing our questions to departmental meetings and working on our behalf on this matter.

Now that restrictions have been eased, Joe said, he is encouraged to see county and provincial committees kickstarting games and competitions and activities once more. He noted that Mini Sevens officer Bernie Ryan was already putting plans in place for this year's Mini Sevens' exhibition games, which was very welcomed.

The Cathaoirleach made reference to the Club-School link and the need for clubs now to show their support for their school team. He mentioned a meeting with GAA delegates he and former chairperson, Liam Magee had attended to discuss the club-school link in 2020. Joe expressed his disappointment that nothing further had arisen since this meeting.

Joe thanked Allianz for their continued support and sponsorship. He urged county/provincial units to use @AllianzIreland and #AllianzCNMB in their PR work. He praised John Manley for the articles and PR work that was produced this year. He mentioned John's work for Allianz Cumann na mBunscol week and he said he is sure it will be a great success again this year.

Joe then went on to speak about the 50th anniversary of the foundation of Cumann na mBunscol. He said that, although Covid prohibited our formal celebration dinner event from happening, exciting developments are happening elsewhere. Joe informed the AGM that he and Ciaran Crowe have been working hard on the book. He expects it to be ready by the end of 2022. Cumann na mBunscol are actively seeking financial contributions and Joe stated that he hoped the GAA would help to fund the project.

Joe finished his address by saying that there are "challenges ahead, but there is light at the end of the tunnel".

Secretary's Report

Secretary, Gary Farrell gave a detailed report covering last year's AGM, Allianz Sponsorship, the new website, Cornmarket insurance, Child Protection and Garda Vetting and the 50th Anniversary Book. He thanked his colleagues on the National Committee and expressed his delight at the return to games this spring/summer term. Proposed: Niamh O'Dea

Treasurer's Report

Micheál MacThiarnáin delivered the Treasurer's report as the financial year concluded while he was still Treasurer. Micheál pointed out the absence of the €68,000 games development grant from the GAA. He hopes it will be forthcoming in the near future. Micheál reported a loss of €22,768 as a result. He also informed delegates of the second account for the book and recorded a balance (at 31 August 2021) of €3,848.

Tim O'Byrne expressed his hope that the Allianz sponsorship would be renewed to its 'pre-Covid' value of €90,000. Jim Fennelly echoed this and asked if there was a reduction in the insurance premium as a result of reduced activities. Micheál informed the meeting that there was a 25% rebate reported.

Tony O'Farrell expressed his gratitude that Allianz continued to sponsor us despite the lack of activities and exposure for the brand. Dave Collins echoed this and said that he would be hopeful that there should be no issue getting the higher sum once activities resumed.

Micheál paid tribute to the county units who, through the pandemic, turned to Twitter and continued their fantastic PR work and promotion of Allianz.

Gerry O'Meara and Mairéad Ní Cheallacháin expressed their concern at the absence of the games development grant from the GAA and hoped that it would be forthcoming.

Micheál wished his successor Liam Breathnach well in his role.

Mini 7's Report

In the information sheet, Bernie outlined the dates for the semi-finals and finals and stated that the names and details of the players needed to be submitted by the end of April. She also reminded delegates that the standard of playing needed to be high so careful consideration needed to be given in choosing hurlers/camogie players in particular. She suggested that (for this year only) that counties could possibly hand back allocated places and these could be redistributed to other counties if necessary. This would have to be done early.

Bernie finished her report by thanking the Dublin Teachers again for their help in Croke Park.

50th Anniversary Publication:

Joe updated the delegates on the progress of the book. He suggested Autumn/Winter 2022 as a likely launch timeframe. He said that it has become a huge task. Their goal is to celebrate Cumann na mBunscol. Thirty out of thirty-two counties have submitted information and materials. Joe thanked those who contributed.

The book publication costs will be approximately €70,000 - €75,000 for 6,000 copies. These will be hardback and that price is for printing only, not distribution. The committee approached the Dept. of Education to ask them to finance distribution to each school in the country. The department has unfortunately declined but re-directed us to the Dept of Arts, Culture, Heritage and the Gaeltacht to ask their assistance. The INTO has donated €10,000, Cornmarket have given €5,000 and although all 32 GAA County Boards have been approached for €500 each, only eight counties have so far donated. Joe Lyons thanked Kilkenny, Leitrim, Kerry, Sligo, Wicklow, Limerick, Cork, and Fermanagh County Boards. Delegates were asked to approach their GAA county secretaries to follow up.

John Murphy paid tribute to Cumann na mBunscol and highlighted its importance to the GAA. He noted the strong link between the GAA and Cumann na mBunscol and alluded to the importance of continuing this strong connection.

Tributes

The Cathaoirleach paid tribute to Francis Lagan, Derry, who died in November 2021 and Eamonn Ryan, Cork, who also died in 2021. Joe extended a vote of sympathy to the families and friends of Paddy Campbell, Down, and Aisling Murphy, Tipperary.

Pat Trainor Award

Dermot Keane, Mayo was the 2021 recipient of the Pat Trainor Award. Fidelma Sheridan read out the citation submitted by the Mayo committee. Dermot was presented with his award by Clodagh Trainor and Mairéad Ní Cheallacháin. Mr. Keane then addressed the meeting.

Gary thanked counties for their co-operation with the distribution of All-Ireland tickets and Bernie Ryan for co-ordinating the mini-sevens so diligently. The report mentioned the work being carried out by John Manley on Twitter and the new website and by Joe Lyons and Ciaran Crowe on the 50th Anniversary book. He mentioned the email from Cornmarket and said that he hoped that Cornmarket will continue to support our Awards event. Handball - many counties are running handball but teachers are not involved, rounders, Young Whistlers, developing ties with London GAA or possibly working with committees and focusing on good practice. He suggested that there may be a survey circulated to county units to assess where the need for support is. Gerry asked delegates for further suggestions:

John Byrne (Meath) asked if the GPOs have come to schools in other counties to promote handball/rounders. Manus O'Donnell (Ulster) reported that there is a full-time handball officer in Ulster and he and Pat McGivern (Tyrone) will meet her.

Jim Fennelly (Kilkenny) expressed concern that dates traditionally set aside for Cumann na mBunscol have become crowded with GAA fixtures since Covid.

Nicola Kennedy (Port Láirge) echoed this point, stating that some school games couldn't be played as clubs were playing/training. Then in July and August, the same children have no games or training.

Jim Dempsey (Loch Garman) suggested delegates sit down with county board/coiste na nóg officers to decide a workable calendar well in advance of games. It was also suggested that these issues be brought to Ard Chomhairle (coaching and fixtures).

A point was raised about the content and standard of coaching schools are receiving. The programme of movement and balance is being taught and delegates questioned whether it should be more games-based. Development report proposed by:

(28th April 2023). She noted the difficulties around teacher tickets and the need to collect them. Mini-Sevens Review was mentioned and Bernie suggested that Cumann na mBunscol should display our “brand” on our Mini-Sevens’ correspondence to parents and teachers - let people know who we are. Bernie went on to thank Tadhg Kenny, Michael Smyth, Gerry O’ Meara, Gearóid and Michelle in Croke Park. She acknowledged the work that went into marking the 50th Anni-versary of Cumann na mBunscol on the jerseys’ crests.

Next year, forms must be returned on time.

Tadhg Kenny raised the issue that the goalie’s position on the field is not ideal and switching goalies is not always an easy task, but he said that it was great having the games at half time.

Tony O’ Farrell (Sciath na Scol) expressed his disappointment at the cut to the teachers’ tick-ets, stating that “lack of appreciation for teachers seems to be a recurring theme”. He also asked why, in the absence of full houses (semi- finals) were teachers’ tickets cut.

Child Protection and Garda Vetting



Mini 7's Report

In life we can sometimes take things for granted. For years we celebrated and participated in Gaelic Games in our primary schools. The games were embedded in our annual school calendar and win, lose or draw they were something to look forward and plan for. Likewise, our INTO Mini 7's. Our small-sided, national competition has been a great part of our schools and games calendar. It is rare to have a competition that encourages all schools, no matter what size, to participate equally in. For the lucky schools, winning the County Mini 7's competition can be a historic event and the excitement of the school being represented in Croke Park during All Ireland semi-finals and finals is a huge honour for the school. What a shock Covid 19 gave us all – not only was our freedom to move about taken away but the joy of games in our schools was also taken away by this virus. A trip to visit Croke Park was more likely to be for a vaccine!

When we were given the green light to resume sports in our schools, there was delight and hope of a more normal school life. It was then fantastic when I got the word from Gearóid Ó Maoilmhichíl that the GAA INTO Mini 7's would go ahead in the same format, with the same numbers, as it did before Covid19. To then receive confirmation from Deirdre O' Connor in INTO Head Office that sponsorship would resume, we knew we could get back to games in our schools. Last year was a short year for the Mini 7's competition. Rather than having two terms to plan for the games, we had approximately 2 months.

- Please include any provincial allocation on the Excel sheet. I would ask provincial secretaries to inform me of the counties getting extra places.
- Young Whistlers should be included on the Excel documents.
- Age limits should be adhered to in all counties.
- Please check that the emails and phone numbers provided are correct.
- Please remember I cannot magic extra places for All-Ireland Finals. Don't make promises to families that I can't follow through on!!

The children who are selected for these exhibition games have the most fantastic day. This year the children were playing at half-time in the games and what a huge honour it was for them to play in front of a full stadium. From our early morning meeting, to getting their kit, getting photographs taken on pitch, enjoying lunch with new friends and lastly walking out on to

the green, grass of Croke Park! A lifetime of memories! There is huge collaboration to enable the children and their families have a great experience. I would like to thank Gearóid and Michelle in Croke Park for all their work with me during the year. Motions 2023

Motion 1

Cumann na mBunscol Luimnigh condemns the decision of Cumann Luthchleas Gael to reduce by 50% the ticket allocation to teachers whose school is represented in the INTO GAA Mini Sevens on the days of the All-Ireland semi-finals and finals.

Cumann na mBunscol Luimnigh calls on an Coiste Naisiúnta to seek a reversal of this decision before the commencement of the 2023 Mini Sevens series. (Luimneach)

Motion 2

Should a child be chosen to play in the Mini 7's in Croke Park, 2 tickets should be allocated to the relevant teacher and sent directly to the teacher before match day. (Corcaigh)



Motion 3

Coiste na Mumhan are requesting that two tickets be given to teachers when a child from their school is involved in the mini-7's (as was the case previously). (Coiste na Mumhan)

Motion 4

Cumann na mBunscol will adopt the following policy on establishing positive club/ school links. The policy will be published on the website of Cumann na mBunscol and communicated to all Coistí before the end of June 2023. (Luimneach)

1. Step 1

Club Chairman contacts the Principal of school(s) in the club's catchment area to arrange a meeting to discuss club/school link for the next school year. This contact to be made in mid to late August

2. Step 2

A meeting takes place, usually in the school, between the Club Chairman and the school Principal.

The aim of this meeting is to clarify

- (a) Does the school want a person to act as a club / school liaison? If so, identify a suitable person to act in this role.
- (b) Identify the needs of the school in the promotion of Gaelic Games for the year ahead
- (c) Clarify how the club can help to meet these needs

3. Step 3

The following conditions are fully understood.

Any person acting as club/school liaison must be Garda Vetted or PSNI vetted. This person will make an appointment when he or she intends to visit the school.

If coaching is identified as an area where the school needs assistance, the liaison person and school will agree on the choice of coach.

Areas to be clarified:

If the school is a mixed school, boys and girls are treated equally.

The coach signs the visitors' book on arrival and departure.

For insurance purposes, a teacher must be present for all coaching sessions.

A timetable is agreed and adhered to. This may be from term to term or for the full school year.

The coach shall familiarise himself/herself with the school's Code of Behaviour before taking up duty.

If a disciplinary issue arises, the coach shall refer the matter to the class teacher.

Confidentiality is non-negotiable.



Motions 2023

Priorities: Coaching may not be the only requirement. Access to the club pitch(es) may be a priority identified. In such cases, the following need to be agreed. This list is not exhaustive.

Who will open the pitch if required for school training or matches?

Will there be portable (juvenile) posts? Who will put them up? Who will take them down?

Who will the school contact for access to club grounds? Club school liaison? Groundsman?

Other areas where the school may need assistance are: equipment, transport to matches, cost of transport to matches etc

4. Final Step

The school Principal and Club Chairman will meet at the end of each school year, usually in late June or early July and review the year to identify successes or shortcomings.

Both parties will seek to agree on what can be done to

improve in the future,

5. Games Manager

The Games Manager in each county shall have a list of all club/school link officers.

Games Manager shall meet Principal / Teacher with responsibility for Gaelic Games before the end of each school year to evaluate the success of the club/school link.

The Games Manager shall collate list of the main issues highlighted in schools in the county in the area of promoting Gaelic games e.g. coaching, finance etc

6. What can the school do for the club?

The school can promote club activities such as registration evenings,

The school can invite club personnel to medal presentations etc.

Successful club teams may visit the school by appointment.

The school may arrange Colours Day, bunting etc when the club is in a county final etc.





Pat Trainor Award

Michael O' Donoghue, former Principal of Courtenay BNS in Newcastle West, was honoured at a dinner in the town in November 2022 when he received the Pat Trainor Award for Lifetime contribution to Gaelic Games in primary schools. Michael was presented with his award by Mairéad O'Callaghan, Uachtarán of Cumann na mBunscol. Mairéad paid tribute to Michael for his work in several roles over many years. She noted that Michael's involvement in Cumann na mBunscol spanned almost four decades and that his contribution to the development of Cumann na mBunscol was immense.

Michael's record as a Cumann na mBunscol activist included the following:

Michael was centrally involved in establishing Cumann na mBunscol in West Limerick in 1974 with the help of Liam Lenihan (Glengurt NS), who went on to become Chairman of Limerick and Munster GAA, Larry Begley (Mountcollins NS) and the late Noel Liston (St Joseph's BNS, Rathkeale) who served as Chairman for over thirty years. Michael was a founder member of the Board and was elected Rúnáí two years later. West Limerick is a vast rural area stretching from the outskirts of Limerick City to the County Kerry border on one side and to the Cork border on the other. It also includes large centres of population in Newcastle West, Abbeyfeale and Adare.

Michael served as Secretary and Treasurer of Cumann na mBunscol West Limerick from 1976 -2007. There are more than forty schools participating in the Cumann na mBunscol West Limerick competitions, which include football for boys and girls, hurling, camogie, I.N.T.O. / G.A.A. mini games and handball.

Joe Lyons, Cathoirleach of Cumann na mBunscol, said that Michael was an unsung hero who did a huge amount of work promoting Gaelic Games in primary schools. As Rúnáí of the West Primary Schools Board, he was responsible for the purchase and distribution of subsidised equipment, i.e., hurleys, helmets, footballs, and hurling balls, for the school in the West Limerick. Michael also organised handball in West Limerick in conjunction with Limerick Handball Board.

As well as his role in West Limerick, Michael served as Secretary of Cumann na mBunscol, Condae Luimnigh from 1989 to 2011, a period of twenty two years unbroken service.

Michael was the first Secretary of Cumann na mBunscol na Mumhan. He served in this role for the first three years of the Coiste's existence from 1990 to 1993, with Donal Whooley (Cork) as Chairman and Brother Anselm



Barrett (Waterford) as Treasurer.

Michael was a Limerick delegate to Cumann na mBunscol na Mumhan meetings for many years. He was also delegate to Cumann na mBunscol Naisiúnta meetings. Michael was Cumann na mBunscol delegate to Limerick County Board meetings and Limerick Coaching and Games meetings.


Michael was involved in the first coaching scheme where coaches went into primary schools to coach Gaelic games, and this scheme continues today and has proved to be an outstanding success.

It must be remembered that Michael was secretary to the above organisation and committees long before the days of notifying people by e-mail, text, Twitter, or other social media.

Michael's wife, Peig, was a great support to him in the organisation of meetings, securing the services of referees, booking playing fields as well as notifying schools of upcoming fixtures.

Speaking after accepting the award, Michael said that he would dedicate the award to the memory of the late Noel Liston, who was the first Chairman of West Limerick Primary Schools Board in 1974 and continued in that role for over thirty years. Noel, who taught in St Joseph's BNS, Rathkeale, was 'Mr West Limerick' and Michael said that his love of Gaelic Games benefitted generations of children in Limerick.

Paul Kennedy, the only other Limerick-based teacher to win this coveted award, was a guest at the presentation.

Cumann na mBunscol is an autonomous National Federation of Primary School Teachers promoting Gaelic Games in an educational context, having affiliated to it County and Provincial Primary Schools Committees. The philosophy of Cumann na mBunscol shall be to promote Gaelic games in an atmosphere of fun and enjoyment and to make Gaelic Games the games of choice in our Primary Schools

- A** This Federation shall be known as “Cumann na mBunscol”. The National logo of “Cumann na mBunscol” shall be The “Cumann na mBunscol” logo”.

All business pertaining to “Cumann na mBunscol” shall be carried out under this name and/or under the “Cumann na mBunscol” “logo”.

- B** Schools with GAA affiliations in other countries may be accepted as associate members on application to the National Committee and subsequent approval.

- C** The aims and objectives of “Cumann na mBunscol” shall be:

(1) To promote and foster our national games, Boys’ Football, Girls’ Football; Hurling; Camogie; Handball and Rounders, Athletics and cultural activities in all the Primary Schools of Ireland and other affiliated areas, in line with National Policy of Cumann na mBunscol and Cumann Lúthchleas Gael.

(2) To promote and foster a positive attitude towards our national games among teachers, pupils, parents and all involved in the promotion of Gaelic Games in the primary education system.

(3) To promote Gaelic Games in an atmosphere of fun and enjoyment and to make Gaelic Games

the games of choice in our primary schools whilst emphasising participation for all.

- C** The function of “Cumann na mBunscol” shall be:

(1) To provide a means for the expression of the collective opinion of its members on matters affecting the interests of Gaelic Games in the Primary Schools of Ireland and other affiliated areas. To this end Cumann na mBunscol shall endeavour to align ourselves to Cumann Luthchleas Gael, its policies and national programmes.

(2) To provide a means whereby talks and negotiations can take place with the relevant Departments of Education and other bodies to promote the aims and interests of “Cumann na mBunscol”.

(3) To establish and administer funds for the general administration of the organisation under the aegis of the GAA and provide financial assistance to affiliated areas by:

- Preparing and submitting an annual budget.
- Raising sponsorship and other finances nationally to help with the overall promotion of the games.

c. Using the Cumann na mBunscol logo in franchising arrangements with business and industry to help raise funds.

(4) To provide advice to members on the best ways of promoting Gaelic Games in Primary Schools.

(5) To endeavour to raise standards in all affiliated areas by

- Coaching
- Seminars
- Publications.

(6) To identify weaknesses with the co-operation of County Coisti, Provincial Councils and other relevant bodies and endeavour to rectify them.

(7) (a) To organise and administer a National Skills Programme (Mini-Sevens) in Boys’ and Girls’ Football, Hurling and Camogie, culminating

(b) To organise a National Skills programme in individual schools in Hurling and Camogie.

(8) To organise and administer National Handball skills programmes, culminating in a National Handball Skills Exhibition in a suitable venue.

(9) To operate and maintain an insurance policy so that cover can be provided for officers and members of committees of “Cumann na mBunscol” while organising and promoting the games/activities.

- D** The philosophy of “Cumann na mBunscol” shall be:

To promote Gaelic Games in an atmosphere of fun and enjoyment and to make Gaelic Games the games of choice in our primary schools.

- E** Constitution: “Cumann na mBunscol” shall be constituted as follows:

- (1) Annual General Meeting
- (2) General Meeting
- (3) Special General Meeting, if required
- (4) National Committee
- (5) Provincial Councils
- (6) County Schools Committees
- (7) Associate Members
- (8) Members

* Annual General Meeting

- (a) The A.G.M. shall be the supreme governing body of the organisation but shall not be involved in the running of local units.
- (b) The AGM shall be held in the month of February or March at a suitable venue chosen by the National Officers.
- (c) The AGM shall consist of
 - (1) The National Officers
 - (2) Two delegates from each county
 - (3) Two delegates from each Provincial Council
 - (4) Two delegates from each affiliated area



N.B. In the event of a Province not being represented on An Coiste Náisiúnta a provincial delegate can be elected at the AGM.

N.B. Every third year the Annual General Meeting will consider a review presented to it by a sub-committee of Cumann na mBunscol on the organisation of the 'Mini-Sevens'. Proposed changes will be voted in and if successful, will come into effect for the following years 'Mini-Sevens'.

*Special General Meeting

1. A special General Meeting may be called by An Coiste Náisiúnta or by the special written request of 12 or more County/Provincial Coisti stating the reason for such a meeting.
2. (a) On the receipt of 12 or more written requests for a Special General Meeting, the National Secretary must inform the Chairman who will call a meeting within 14 days.
(b) An Coiste Náisiúnta must also give 14 days written notice of the Special General Meeting.
3. The Special General Meeting shall consist of
 - (a) The Officers of Cumann na mBunscol
 - (b) Two delegates from each affiliated County
 - (c) Two delegates from each Provincial Council.
 - (d) Two delegates from each affiliated area (non-voting).
4. Business of Special General Meeting.

The only business that will be discussed at the meeting is the business requested as the reason for calling the meeting.

* Officers and National Committee

1. All members of the National Committee shall be elected annually at the AGM. All officers may hold office for a maximum period of five years.
2. All members of the National Committee are limited to two consecutive maximum terms of office, but not in the same office.

A member may however seek office again after a minimum of one year's break.
3. The National Committee shall carry out the business of Cumann na mBunscol between Annual General Meetings. They shall meet regularly and attend to all current business.
4. The National Committee may appoint sub-committees as required to assist them with a current task or problem.

5. The National Committee may accept units from other countries on approval of application for associate membership of Cumann na mBunscol.
6. The Cathaoirleach shall see that the rules of the organisation are enforced sensibly and fairly on all occasions.
7. In an event of the enforced absence of the Cathaoirleach, the Leas-Chathaoirleach shall preside over the meetings and act in all cases as Cathaoirleach.
8. All sub-committees set up by the National Committee will be chaired by another member other than the Cathaoirleach and Leas-Chathaoirleach.
9. The Assistant Secretary shall minute all meetings and ensure that a copy of the minutes be available for the next meeting.
10. All routine correspondence with affiliated areas shall be done by the Secretary.
11. All correspondence with the GAA, State Departments and Public Bodies shall be carried out by the Secretary in consultation with the other bodies.
12. (a) The National Treasurer shall be responsible for verification of all expenses


(b) The Treasurer, in conjunction with Accounts Department Croke Park shall be responsible for
 - (i) The maintenance of proper financial records.
 - (ii) An annual audit of the accounts.
 - (iii) Presentation of accounts to the Annual General Meeting.
13. The PRO shall in consultation with the other officers:
 - (a) Take every available opportunity to publicise the work of Cumann na mBunscol and to ensure that Gaelic games are promoted as the games of choice in our primary schools.

- (b) Ensure that the 'Aims and Objectives' of Cumann na mBunscol be protected and advanced in dealing with outside agencies.
- (c) Prepare all National Press Releases on behalf of An Coiste Naisiunta, Cumann na mBunscol.
- 14.** The Development Officer shall in consultation with the other officers:
- (a) Endeavour to raise standards in all counties by holding seminars, coaching courses, issue publications and liaise with relevant bodies in pursuit of this objective.
- (b) Identify weaknesses and with the help of County Coisti, Provincial Councils and other relevant bodies seek to rectify them.
- 15.** The delegate to Central Council will in consultation with the other officers promote the interests of Cumann na mBunscol at Central Council and endeavour to promote Primary School games at all times.
- 16.** The remaining members of the National Committee shall be the President, Assistant Secretary and if necessary Provincial delegates.
- 17.** A Provincial Delegate will be a full member of the National Committee with full voting rights.
- Provincial Councils**
- 1.** Provincial Councils shall be properly constituted under the aims and objectives of "Cumann na mBunscol".
 - 2.** An Annual General Meeting of each Provincial Council will be held annually. This AGM is to be attended by the President of Cumann na mBunscol or his/her nominee from An Coiste Náisiúnta.
 - 3.** The Provincial Secretary must inform the National Secretary of the venue and date of the Provincial AGM.
 - 4.** Provincial Councils shall meet at least three times annually.
(b) The Provincial AGM is to be held before the National AGM.
 - 4.** Those entitled to vote at this meeting shall be the elected provincial officers and two delegates from each county.
 - 5.** Those entitled to speak at this meeting shall be the elected officers and either of the two delegates from each county.
 - 6.** Invited guests may speak at the invitation of the Provincial Council.
 - 7.** Delegates must attend a minimum of two out of three meetings.
 - 8.** At this meeting the delegates will elect officers and a committee to run the affairs of the Provincial Council between Provincial Annual General Meetings.
 - 9.** The Minutes of the Provincial AGM must be sent to the National Secretary within a month of the Provincial AGM.
 - 10.** The annual financial statement must be sent to the National Treasurer within a month of the Provincial AGM.
 - 11.** Failure to send either the minutes or annual financial statement within a month of the Provincial AGM shall result in sanctions.
 - 12.** This committee shall promote the aims of Cumann na mBunscol and endeavour to raise the standards of Gaelic Games within the Province.
 - 13.** Each Provincial Council will liaise with An Coiste Naisiunta and the Provincial Councils of the GAA and other relevant bodies and endeavour to generate funds for the promotion and development of Cumann na mBunscol activities in that Province.
 - 14.** Two delegates from each Provincial Council will attend the Annual General Meeting and Special Meetings of Cumann na mBunscol.

15. An annual written report shall be presented to An Coiste Náisiúnta.
16. (a) The Provincial Treasurer shall be responsible for verification of all expenses
(b) The Treasurer, shall be responsible for
 - (i) The maintenance of proper financial records.
 - (ii) An annual audit of the accounts.
 - (iii) Presentation of accounts to the Annual General Meeting.
17. Each Provincial Committee will notify and invite a delegate from An Coiste Náisiúnta to the Provincial AGM, in the absence of the National President.
18. Provincial status is to be granted to GB.
19. Motions to the Provincial AGM, which shall be in the name of a County Coiste and formally adopted at a meeting of that body, must reach the Provincial Secretary not later than three weeks before the AGM.
20. All nominations for positions on the Provincial Committee which shall be in the name of a county Coiste and formally adopted at a meeting of that body, must reach the Provincial Secretary not later than three weeks before the AGM.
21. Copies of the agenda for the Provincial AGM together with list of motions and nominations for elections to the Provincial committee shall be circulated to the county Coiste in that province at least 7 days before the AGM.
22. The provincial secretary must inform the National Secretary of the venue and date of the Provincial AGM at least three weeks in advance of the meeting.
2. The Cathaoirleach shall preside over all meetings and shall see that the rules of the organisation be enforced sensibly and fairly on all occasions.
3. Motions to the Annual General Meeting, which shall be in the name of County Coistí, Provincial Council or An Coiste Náisiúnta and formally adopted at a meeting of that body, must reach the National Secretary not later than four weeks before the AGM.
4. All nominations for positions on the National Committee which shall be in the name of an affiliated area or Provincial Council and formally adopted at a meeting of that body, must reach the National Secretary not later than three weeks before the AGM.
5. Copies of the agenda for the AGM together with list of motions and nominations for elections to National Committee shall be circulated to all affiliated areas and Provincial Councils at least 7 days before the AGM.
6. Amendments and agenda will be with the National Secretary in writing in the name of an affiliated area or Provincial Council at least one hour before the AGM.
7. Contrary motions shall not be accepted.
8. All motions must be clear and unambiguous and must not conflict with the aims and objectives of Cumann na mBunscol.
9. (a) To be deemed in order a motion must be implementable and must be specific to Cumann na mBunscol.
(b) However motions may call on Cumann na mBunscol to negotiate with relevant bodies on a specific matter that is of interest to Cumann na mBunscol.

Standing Orders

1. A Standing Orders sub-committee comprising of the Provincial Chairmen or Secretaries or their nominee shall consider all motions and nominations and decide if they are in order and acceptable for presentation at the AGM.
10. The mover of a proposal shall speak for not more than two minutes.
11. The seconder of a proposal shall speak for no more than two minutes.

12. No motion shall be discussed for more than 20 minutes. The motion must be disposed of when the 20 minutes have elapsed. No speaker shall speak for more than two minutes.
 13. Each delegate shall register and each speaker shall identify themselves, name and unit.
 14. The mover shall have the right of reply in all cases. 2 minutes maximum.
 15. Voting shall be by a show of hands on all motions. A simple majority shall ensure the adoption of any item. Where rule changes are proposed, a two thirds majority shall be necessary in every instance to ensure their adoption.
 16. The usual method for the disposal of amendments and agenda shall be followed.
 17. In the event of the proposition "That the question be put", and that this proposition be seconded, the presiding Cathaoirleach shall on a show of hands either continue the debate or 'Put the question'.
 18. In the event of the proposition "That the AGM, move to next business" and that this proposition be seconded, the presiding Cathaoirleach shall put the proposition to a vote immediately. If defeated the debate shall be resumed.
 19. If a position on the National Committee be contested, voting shall be by secret ballot. A successful candidate must have 50% + 1 of the valid votes cast by delegates present and voting at the AGM. In the event of a tie, the winning candidate will be drawn by lot.
 20. The Cathaoirleach may at his/her discretion ask if there is no obvious objection to a motion that the motion be put in order, to save time.
 21. The Cathaoirleach may at his/her discretion and in consultation with order officers change the order of business in the interest of efficiency.
 22. The order of business may also be changed at the request of a majority of delegates present and voting.
 23. Only properly constituted delegates may speak at the AGM.
 24. Other speakers may only address the AGM when prior arrangements are made through the National Committee.
- * Grievances and Complaints in all matters**
1. Grievances and complaints in regard of matters within an area will be settled within that area.
 2. Each County will have a constitutionally elected Coiste Gearán to deal with appeals arising from decisions of the County Coiste.
 3. Complaints, Objections and Counter Objections:
Any complaints or objections must be lodged with the Runaí Chontae in writing within 3 days of the game. The Runaí informs the other party who also has 3 days to respond in writing.

The matter can then be dealt with by the Coiste Chontae. The decision will then be conveyed to both parties. Any party dissatisfied with the decision of the Coiste may appeal in writing to the Runaí Chontae Cumann na mBunscol within 3 days. This appeal will be heard by the Coiste Gearán.
 4. Coiste Gearán:
This is an appeals body.

A minimum of 5 are elected to this committee at the A.G.M. No member of the Officer Board of Coiste Chontae, Cumann na mBunscol or anybody who has heard the original objection may sit on An Coiste Gearán. No member of the Coiste Gearán may consider any appeal involving their own school. The Coiste Gearán may call all interested parties. A quorum of 3 is necessary to hear all appeals. The decision of the Coiste Gearán is final and binding.

(a) Grievances, complaints and objections dealing with issues outside County Jurisdiction will be dealt with by the National Committee and that decision will be final.

5. Sanctions will be taken against any Coiste, National, Provincial or County or any member for the following reasons:
- bringing the organisation into disrepute, or
 - failure to implement National Policy.

* Sanctions

1. Misuse of organisational funds. Automatic Disassociation.
2. Conduct unbecoming a member of 'Cumann na mBunscol'. Automatic Disassociation.
3. Failure of a County to furnish a statement of accounts. Withholding of grants and tickets.
4. Failure of a County to furnish a secretary's report. Withholding of grants and tickets.
5. Failure to hold an A.G.M. plus relevant meetings and two additional meetings. Withholding of all monies and tickets due to that County / Provincial Coiste.
6. Failure of County / Provincial units to honour obligations to sponsorship agreements. Withholding of sponsorship monies.
7. Failure to comply with/implement the Constitution. Withholding of grants and other benefits.
8. Failure to comply with/implement National Policy. Withholding of grants and other benefits.

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
